As a BSA High Adventure program, Birchbark Expedition programs are open to scouts 13+ years old and have successfully passed a BSA swimmer test within the last 12 months.



PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Birchbark Expeditions Adirondack Adventure canoeing program is a week-long high-adventure experience for Scouts BSA and Venture units, operating in New York's Adirondack region.

Treks start with two training sessions at base camp, working on paddling, portaging, and in-camp skills

During their expedition, crews will follow their custom pre-planned itinerary through the pristine lakes and forests of the Adirondack region, enjoying the incredible views, wildlife and camaraderie. Crews will also have an opportunity to visit one of many cultural features or hiking trails in the area.

Advancement opportunities include: 50 Miler Award, Canoeing, Cooking, Camping, and many other merit badges

Staffed by a team of volunteer guides from GNFC, the program is very cost-effective.
